


Virginia Photographer to Show Work at Landis Homes





Book of the Month

Rebekah Johnsen, Director of Residential Living Recommendation by Polly Ann Brown, Landis Homes Climate Change/Creation Care Group

In her book, *Ask the Beasts*, Catholic theologian Elizabeth Johnson points to Job, "that suffering man in the land of Uz", who tells his friends to tap into a source of wisdom they ignore: *Ask the beasts and they will teach you; ask the plants of the earth and they will teach you; and the fish of the sea will declare to you. Who among these does not know that the hand of the Lord has done this? In his hand is the life of every living thing, and the breath of every human being. Job 12:7-9.*



By interrogating flora and fauna, we will be led to the overflowing goodness of the living God. Writes Johnson, "Once one understands that the community of life on Earth is God's beloved creation and its ruination unspeakable sin, then [love in action] on behalf of ecojustice becomes an indivisible part of one's life."

We owe nothing less than this expression of love to the most vulnerable: refugees and migrants, communities of color, indigenous and forest-dwelling peoples, nomadic shepherds, poverty-stricken groups around the world especially women and children, who suffer disproportionately from the effects of climate change. It is not too late. The 2021 Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change report indicates that some of the worst outcomes are still avoidable. Our action (or inaction) will determine the future course of climate – a future which our children and global neighbors will inhabit. Katharine Hayhoe, Christian climate scientist writes, "We must act so we can feel hopeful – not the other way around."

Lent is a solemn religious observance in the Christian liturgical calendar commemorating the 40 days Jesus spent fasting in the desert, according to the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke, before beginning his public ministry, during which he endured temptation by Satan.

This season is observed in the Anglican, Eastern Orthodox, Lutheran, Methodist, Moravian, Oriental Orthodox, Reformed, United Protestant and Roman Catholic Churches. Some Anabaptist, Baptist and nondenominational Christian churches also observe Lent.

We will begin the Season of Lent on Ash Wednesday, March 2, during the morning West Bethany Chapel devotions at 8:15 a.m. led by Mary and Paul Zehr and will have ashes for anyone who desires.

You are welcome to attend. The service will be rebroadcast as usual at 1:15 pm.

Pet Enhanced Therapy Services (KPETS) Comes to Landis Homes

Landis Homes is happy to announce that Keystone Pet Enhanced Therapy Services (KPETS) will be moving their offices to the campus of Landis Homes, beginning February 1, 2022.

KPETS, founded in 2003, by Karen Gerth, is designed to provide volunteer teams of humans and animals to promote well-being by sharing the power of human-animal interactions. Their more than 300 volunteer teams provide thousands of hours yearly at no cost to hundreds of locations in South Central PA and Northern Maryland.

When the organization's lease was ending at their location for the past nearly five years, Karen began seeking other options. She contacted Susan Paul, Personal Care Home Administrator at Landis Home. Within a day, she heard from Director of Campus Services Adam Gardner about the availability of space in Leaman Place, a converted cottage now serving as office space. It has the added perk of an enclosed dog park attached to it.


